## The 32<sup>nd</sup> Sun Valley Hard Tissue Workshop

## Introduction

In this issue we are fortunate to have speakers from the Thirty-second International Sun Valley Hard Tissue Workshop, August 4-8, 2002, Sun Valley, Idaho, USA, allow us to publish the expanded summaries of their talks. They contain the guts of the material presented, with references. They are invaluable in that they serve to prepare one for interdisciplinary discussion as well as to point investigators in other disciplines to key references and to seek out with whom to explore collaborative studies.

This year's Workshop featured fewer speakers that allowed for more time for dynamic discussions. [One can never experience such exchange unless they have attended a Sun Valley Hard Tissue Workshop.] Instead of a short summary, several speakers from the Bone Cancer and Cancer Cell Metastasis sessions have generated mini-review articles that were peer reviewed in lieu of a summary of their talks (H. Donahue, D. Welch, C. Bagi) and will be published in a later issue. Also David Burr was successful in his tough task of extracting "Where we are and where to go next" type summaries from each Chairperson. These summaries are published here after each session.

The Thirty-second Workshop covered six topics, a plenary lecture by Professor A. Michael Parfitt along with a poster session with a wine and cheese socializer and Workshop wrap-up and summaries session.

• "Bone Cancer", organized and chaired by Janet Hock (articles by Hock, Gorlick, Miller, Hansen, Mantyh and summary by Hock).

• "Cancer Cell Metastasis", organized and chaired by Cedo Bagi (Bagi, Keller, Guise, Keller and a summary by Bagi).

• "Osteoblast Biology in Osteoporosis", organized and chaired by Janet Hock (articles by Jilka, Fedarko, Ke\*, and a summary by Hock).

The Workshop concluded with an important session on Workshop Wrap-up and Summary chaired and edited by David Burr (summaries by Schaffler, Bendele, Burr, Hock (2) and Bagi). The summaries are found at the end of each topic.

Also printed are the abstracts from 28 posters that were displayed at the Workshop.
